

Cypress Hills Interprovincial Park



Welcome to Cypress Hills Interprovincial Park. We hope you enjoy your stay and are able to enjoy the many recreational activities that are available.

What to do...

Accommodation

The park has over 600 campsites ranging from rustic to full service and includes group campgrounds and barrier free sites. There is firewood, trailer sewage dumping stations, playgrounds and picnic areas. West Block offers rustic and equestrian camping. Most park services are available from mid-May to the September long weekend. The Resort at Cypress Hills offers year-round hotel rooms, townhouses and cabins, conference/meeting rooms, lounge, dining room, and fitness room.

Fishing

Rainbow and Brook Trout can be caught in Loch Leven and Belanger Creek. Fishing licenses are available at the Administration Office.

Beach

The main beach at Loch Leven has change rooms, washrooms, outdoor shower, playground and picnic area. The beach is unsupervised.

Picnicking/Day Use

Day-use picnic areas can be found at the main beach, across the road from the swimming pool, and across the road from the mini-golf. These areas are none reservable. Barbeque stands in day-use picnic areas are for use with charcoal briquettes only. Need directions? Ask at the Visitor Centre or the Administration Office about locations..

Interpretive Programs

The park's Interpreters offer a variety of guided and self-guided programs and activities throughout the summer. For information on upcoming interpretive programs, please stop by the Visitor Centre, Administration Office, or speak with a Campground Host.

Park & Recreation Facilities

Programing is offered through the summer and winter at the park's Visitor Centre, Amphitheatre, and Observatory. In addition, the park features a swimming pool (with hot tub & sauna), ball diamond, tennis / pickleball court, horseshoe pits, tetherball, beach volleyball, basketball, lookout points, trails, and auto tour route. Park Facts

- West Block: 81.6 sq km (51 sq mi); 14000 hectares (34580 acres); highest elevation 1393 m (4567 ft) on private land near the AB border
- Highest elevation east of the Rocky Mountains
- Dark-Sky Preserve

- Centre Block: 28.8 sq km (18 sq mi); 4500 hectares (11115 acres); highest elevation 1281 m (4200 ft) at Bald Butte
- Unique lodgepole pine & spruce forest mixed with aspen and willow groves
- 730 plant species – 20% of these are provincially rare & unique
- Unique orchid species population
- Larger mammals include moose, elk, whitetail deer, mule deer, antelope & cougars
- Smaller mammals include fox, coyotes, porcupines, raccoons, bobcats, lynx, minks, squirrels & other
- 220 species of birds, some are unique to the area
- Winter activities include cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, snowshoeing, tobogganing & winter camping

For Your Safety and Comfort

Public Safety

Although Conservation Officers patrol the park, please do not leave valuables unattended or in open view. If you have a problem/concern please contact the Park Watch line at **1-800-667-1788**. Fires are permitted in park barbeques only. All vehicles are restricted to park roads and parking lots at all times.

Pets

Please be a responsible pet owner! Pets must be kept on a leash at all times. Pets are not allowed in any public structures such as washrooms, change houses, picnic shelters or concessions; nor are they allowed on the beach. Dogs running loose or left barking in campsites can disturb the enjoyment of other park visitors and fines can be laid against the owner.

Park Guidelines & Regulations

- Wood fires in campground fire pits only. Briquettes only in day-use area barbecue stands.
- No camping in areas other than designated park campsites
- Park entry permit required year round.
- 20 kilometre-per-hour speed restriction in campgrounds.
- 5 mile per hour horsepower restriction on Loch Leven.
- No boating activity within 25 metres of a beach area.
- Alcohol and cannabis may be consumed only in your campsite.
- Removing firewood from the park is theft. Leave unused firewood in your campsite
- No cutting of trees without special park authorization or permit.
