Snowshoeing

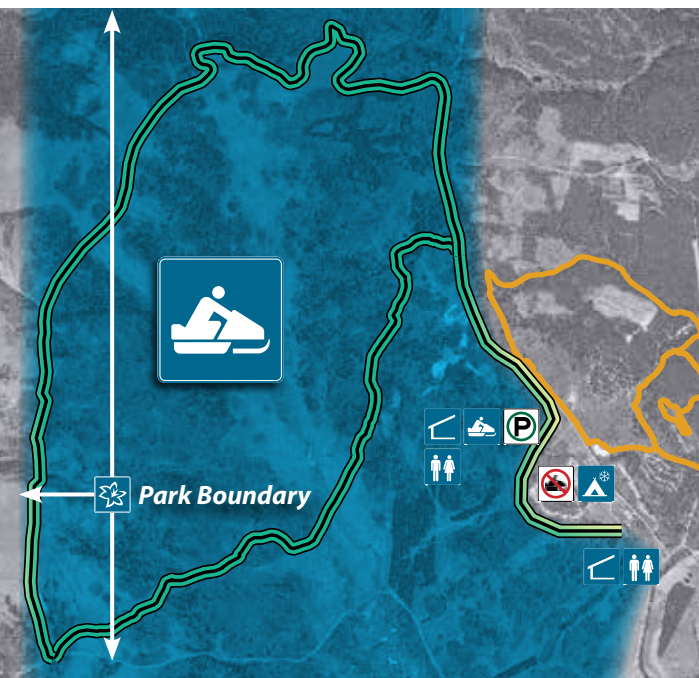
The park now has a couple of different marked snowshoe trails with warm-up shelters for you to enjoy - and they are both pet friendly.

Snowmobile

Our snowmobile area with trail, staging area (in the Dark Sky Campground) and warm up shelters, is available all season long depending on the snow base. (see map below)

Tobogganing hill and toboggan luge track are located on the hill behind the Visitor Centre.

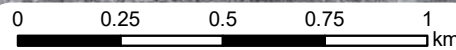
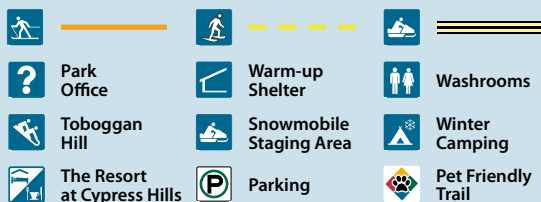
