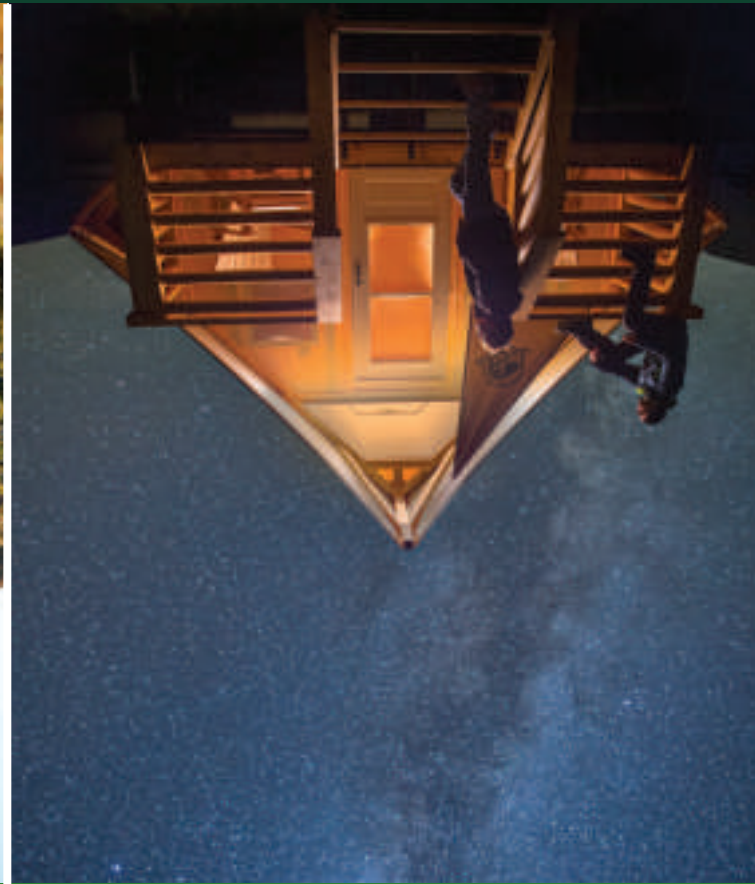
Frenchman Valley Campground

Insider tip: Bring your camera and don't miss sunset at the top of 70-Mile Butte Trail in the West Block!

Backpacking

Enjoy the true wilderness of the only national prairie park through backpacking!

Insider tip: Walk where dinosaurs roamed and traverse the East Block wilderness. Watch out for quicksand then explore the hoo doos in the Valley of 1,000 Devils!

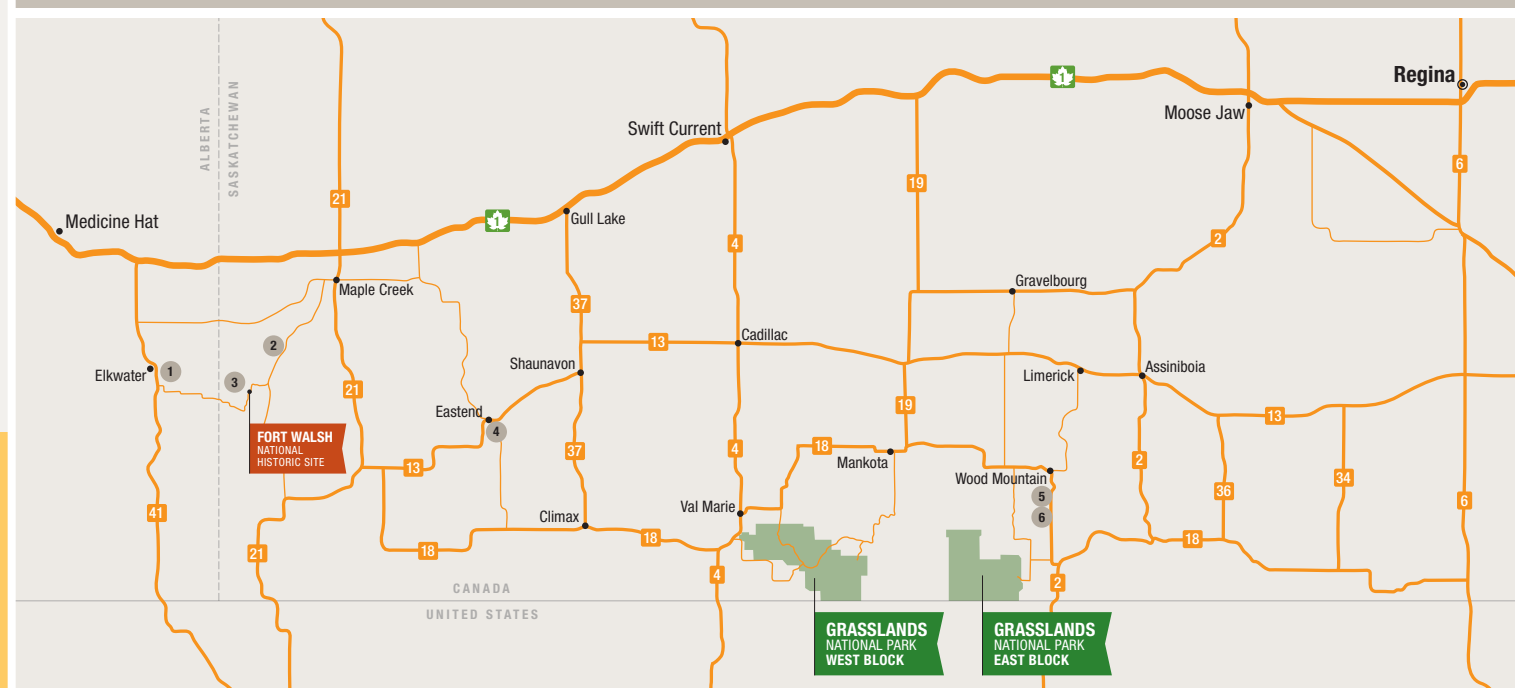
