Snags (dead trees) - great for bird watching

Fallen Tree - home to insects

Drumming Log - Male Ruffed Grouse use this log for "drumming"; rapidly beating their wings to attract female grouse.

Oldest Tree - White Spruce. This tree is over 150 years old.

Prairie Lily - Saskatchewan's official provincial flower. This flower is protected and illegal to pick.


Marsh Marigold - From the Buttercup family, this small golden flower grows in swamps and along stream edges.

- 4. Please do not disturb the wildlife, or they might move away!
