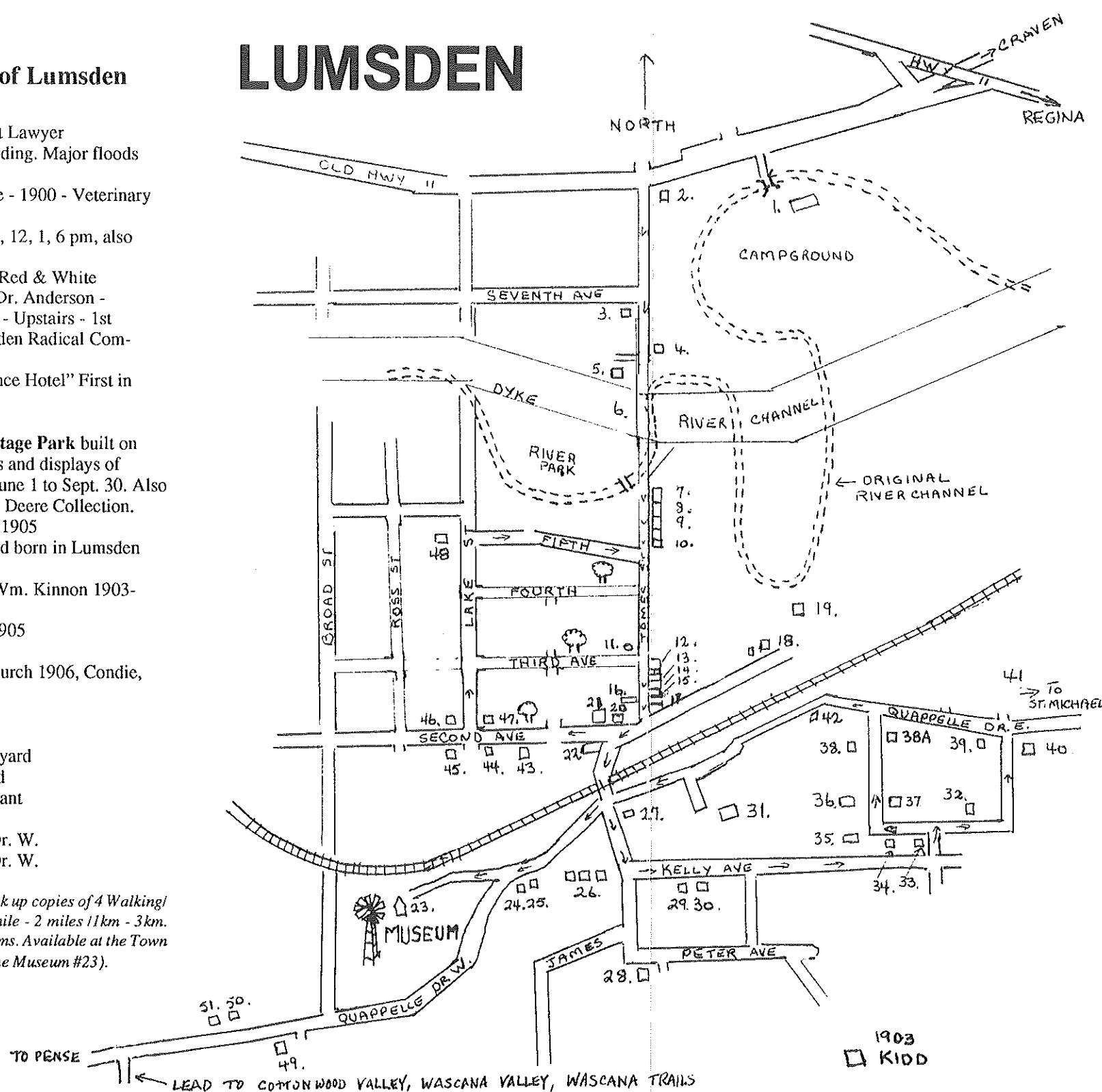


## A Walking Tour of Lumsden
